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



I coax trust, contact and vulnerability from my subjects in order to produce an image from which the viewer can then create his own world. Recurring themes are religion, society and mythology; each work is intensely personal and takes both me and my subject on a journey that provokes fundamental questions about life and our existence.

Art has always been part of my life. I grew up in an inter-

national art scene in Europe, I spent years in front of the camera as an actress and model.

Then my life's work changed when my late mother's last gift, a camera, inspired me and became the drive behind the creation of new life.

I want my art to be more than photographs. I seek out innovative printing technologies to create images with depth and richness, so they appear almost three-dimensional.

In 2009, Micky Hoogendijk received a last gift from her ailing mother: a professional still camera.

The gift would change her career forever. Two months later, her mother passed away, and she moved to San Francisco, where she discovered the majestic lines and architecture of the city through the eye of the camera.

By 2010, living and working again in Los Angeles, Micky Hoogendijk discovered her gift for artistic portraits.

In 2012 she moved to Austin, Texas, where she created her first body of work. By 2015 she returned to Los Angeles, where she continues her work as an artist.

In 2018 she returned to Europe and lives and works in the South of Holland near the Belgium boarder in a beautiful studio with her own gallery adjacent to that.

Micky Hoogendijk's photographic work has appeared in art shows like Art Platform Los Angeles, E- merge Art Fair in Washington DC, Contemporary Art Fair in Istanbul, Art Fair for Modern and contemporary Art Cologne Germany, Art Toronto Canada, Rotterdam Contemporary Art fair, Amsterdam PAN, KunstRai and ForReal. Exhibitions in London, Vancouver Canada, Karlsruhe, Los Angeles, Austin TX, Santa Fe NM, Bogota-Colombia, Mexico City, Amsterdam and her work even went all the way to Tokyo, Japan.

She has garnered both critical acclaim and commercial success and has signed with galleries in Amsterdam, Houston, Santa Fe, Mexico City and Los Angeles, Vancouver and the UK.







Maintaining complete silence, we sat in the hope that the cheetah and cubs would come to the water. I set my camera at the highest ISO that I was comfortable with and considering the dim light I op-

ted for a slower shutter speed than I usually use. I knew that even at a 400th of a second, it would be a challenge to hold a 700mm lens still enough for a sharp image. While I worked the settings the mother cheetah peeked through thick bushes, before slowly making her way to the water, stopping every few steps to scan the area for danger. Much to our joy her little cubs followed her, and, after what seemed like an eternity, they reached the water. She stood tall, scanning the area once again as the cubs began to drink, and then she leaned over to protect them and to drink. That was my opportunity. Within a few

minutes, they disappeared back into the thick bushes, and the moment was over. I love this image because it is a perfect example of how effort and patience come together for the perfect shot.

Judges' comment

Cuteness aside, this is a beautiful portrayal of a watchful mom and her cautious cubs so well-framed beneath her protective body as they drink.

New rules on copyright for the internet are coming.

The new rules are intended to reduce the differences between copyrights in the European Union (EU). Furthermore, the new rules must better protect the makers of images and music.

As many people as possible should also have access to material that is available on the internet.

The main changes are:

Internet platforms are liable for content that users upload.

This means that they themselves must ensure that illegally uploaded films, music and lyrics cannot be shared.

NEW COPYRIGHT RULES

Major platforms such as YouTube, Facebook and Google have to pay money for copyrighted videos, photos or music that their users upload.

The same goes for Google News, which takes over news from media











- Platforms will not be held directly responsible for unlicensed material if they have "carefully and optimally" tried to hold back the material.
- The rules allow an exception for "quotation, criticism, caricature, parody or pastiche".
- Some uploaded materials, such as memes or GIFs, are specifically excluded from the rule.

- Hyperlinks to news articles, along with "individual words or very short excerpts", may be freely shared.
- Journalists must receive a portion of all copyright related revenues from their publishing house.
- Lighter obligations apply to startup platforms.




